In connexion with the National Field Day organized by the Radio Society of Great Britain, authority is hereby granted for you to operate a portable amateur wireless sending and receiving station on land in the open air under the following conditions:-

Call Sign: *G 6 Q M/P*

Location: *Field adjoining Hadley Wood Common, Coxborough*

Frequencies: In the authorized amateur bands.

Power: not to exceed 5 watts input.

Dates: 7 and 8 June, 1952.

Emission: CW (A.1) only

Apart from the above exceptions, the station must be operated in accordance with the conditions of the amateur wireless licence issued to you.

This letter, and the amateur wireless licence, should be held personally by you during the contest in case you are challenged by the police or other Government authority.
